

ISRAEL'S PERPLEXITY By Sam Stern

The mood among the lewish people today can be described as perplexed, uncertain and bewildered. They feel as if they are standing on a volcano which is about to erupt and that this catastrophe will shatter, crumble and destroy all the tradition and culture that the Jewish people have built up during the 2000 years In the diaspora. This mood emerged after the October War of 1973 in which 3000 young Jewish soldiers were killed. Another loss of this war was their retreat from the Suez Canal and some parts of the vital Golan Heights as part of the ceasefire negotiations with the Syrians and

Before the October War the Jewish people in Israel and throughout the world considered the military establishment in Israel invincible. They believed that they were stronger than all the Arab countries. Some even believed that Israel was stronger than the Russians. This poor judgment of the ability and effectiveness of the Arab soldiers led the Jews to live in a world of overestimation while they held the illusion of underestimation of their enemy.

As a result of the shock of reality that the October War brought, the Israeli Parliament (Knesset) set up a special committee to investigate the reason that Israel was not prepared when Egypt attacked her on the Day of Atonement. The committee reported that Israel did not believe

that Egypt would start a war against such a strong defensive line as the Israeli Bar Lev Line at the Suez Canal. Yet the Bar Lev Line was totally destroyed in the first 24 hours of battle. Another defeat was cited when a cease-fire was ordered after Ien days of battle, when the Israeli Army was on their way to Cairo and Damascus. Not only did Israel fail to enter Cairo and Damascus but they were forced to relinquish some of the territory they occupied in the previously successful Six Day War of June 1967.

Relinquishing territories won while receiving nothing in return from Syria or Egypt in a separation agreement arranged by the United States came as a great setback to the Israelis. Further, they realized that they are only a very small nation of less than three million people, living in an area smaller than the State of Rhode Island. They realized that they do not have the power to make an independent decision in such important matters as foreign policy and strategic agreements with their adversaries, without the initiation and intervention of Henry Kissinger and the United States. Many of the young people in Israel started asking the question: "Why should we give our lives for a war that we cannot win?" Many believe that Israel is unable to withstand the tremendous pressure from the Arabs and the communists without active American support, making Israel totally dependent

upon the United States. One of the strict Orthodox religious groups in Israel, called Neturei Karta, asked former President Nixon to make Israel the "52nd American State."

The Israeli press and periodicals are teeming with articles and letters expressing depression and disappointment in their leaders. The present Israell government, whose Prime Minister is Gen. Itzhak Rabin, leans mainly upon the Labor Party and a small Arab group in the Knesset. Gen. Rabin's Cabinet has a majority of only one vote in the Knesset. The present government is being attacked by the rabbis who want to dominate the entire life of lews in Israel. The main issue that they want to decide is "Who is a Jew?" They also want the right to outlaw all missionary activities in Israel. The leaders of these religious groups are Rabbi Avadia Joseph and Rabbi Shlomo Goren, who is also an army general.

On the other hand, the Israeli leftwing and communist groups want to make Israel a communist country under Arab and Russian rule. These two extreme movements are growing among the citizens. The head of the leftist group is Meyer Wilner who is known to take instructions directly from Moscow. As a result of the strong clashes between the extremists, the Israelis are confused and depressed and they try different ways to escape reality. Some emigrate to the United States, some to West Germany and other European countries. The latest statistics signify that over 100,000 Israelis who now live in the United States have become American citizens and refuse to return to Israel.

One of the main reasons for the perplexity and confusion of the Israelis is the continuing attacks by Arab terrorists on civilians. Recently over 60 civilians were killed by the terrorists in a period of eight weeks. One survivor in Kiriat Shmonah told a reporter: "It is very bad when you don't know who is the one who knocks at your door any hour of the day or night. Is he a foe who came to kill you, or a friend? The Arabs look exactly like lews. They speak perfect Hebrew, so who knows what to do? How can you sleep a peaceful night?"

The lewish people are God's chosen people, not because they are strong militarily or because they are large in number. God has chosen them as a witness to all the nations of the world that He is the creator of heaven and earth. "The Lord did not set his love upon you, nor choose you, because ye were more in number than any people; for ye were the fewest of all people: But because the Lord loved you, and because he would keep the oath which he had sworn unto your lathers" (Deuteronomy 7:7-8). God has not changed. He is the same vesterday. today and forever. God is not interested in Israel's military status, but rather in their spiritual stature! God wants the Jews in Israel and all over the world to proclaim the gospel of peace to the entire world, including the Arab nations. God is waiting patiently for each and every Jew to accept His Son the Lord Jesus Christ, and become a testimony of peace to the nations of the world. Only Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace, is able to bring peace and tranquility to the Middle East.

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THE POWER OF THE WORD

We live in a time when the voice of Satan is being heard but the Word of God is being repressed. The devil's words are being preached in many places. False prophets run rampant on every corner of the streets in large cities. The devil knows that his time is short and that he will soon be destroyed. Therefore he makes his words heard in pulpits of the anti-Christians. False doctrines, false interpretations of the Word of God, and false promises bring destruction, war, pestilence and sorrow. 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WHY A NEW COVENANT?

Does Israel need a new covenant? There are seven covenants recorded in the Old Testament. The seventh covenant God made is in the form of a prophecy and was made with the nation of Israel and with individual members of that nation. It is to this seventh covenant that we wish to direct our attention. The Hebrew Bible calls this prophesied covenant a "new" covenant or new testament. Three major Old Testament prophets, Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Ezekiel, were employed to issue the promises of this covenant to Israel. What is the nature of this covenant?

First of all, according to Ezekiel 16:60, the new covenant is unconditional. The God of Israel says, "I will establish an everlasting covenant with you."

Secondly, the new covenant involves inward regeneration of the human spirit, Isaiah put it this way in 59:21, "And as for me, this is my covenant with them, says the Lord, my spirit which is upon you and my words which I have put in your mouth shall not depart from your mouth nor from the mouth of your offspring . . . says the Lord, from now and forever."

Thirdly, Ezekiel informs us that the new covenant for Israel would involve a special ministry of the Holy Spirit, "And I will put my spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes and you will be careful to observe my ordinances" (Ezekiel 36:27).

Fourthly, the new covenant includes great material blessing. We read in Jeremiah 33:40-41, "And I will make an everlasting covenant with them ... and I will rejoice over them to do them good, and I will faithfully plant them in this land with all my heart and with all my soul." Such a new covenant, according to Ezekiel 37:26-27 includes a rebuilt temple. We learn in Isaiah 61:8-9 that the new testament will last forever.

Jeremiah declares in 31:31-34, "Behold, days are coming, declares the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah. Not like the covenant which I made with their fathers in the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt, my covenant which they broke, although I was an husband to them, declares the Lord, but this is the covenant which I will make with the house of Israel after those days, . . . I will put my law within them and on their heart I will write it, and I will be their God, and they shall be my people; for I will forgive their liniquity and their sin will I remember no more."

Why does Israel need a new covenant? Obviously it is because they annulled and broke the covenant that God had made with them.

Isaiah pointed up the sin and iniquity of Israel in chapter 1:4-5, saying, "A lost sinful nation, people weighed down with iniquity, offspring of evildoers, sons who act corruptly. They have abandoned the Lord, they have despised the Holy One of Israel, they have turned away from Hlm." Ezra, the Jewish scribe, sums it up for all the prophets when he said in chapter 9, "Our iniquities have risen above our heads, and our guilt has grown even to the heavens; since the days of our fathers to this day we have been in great guilt, and on account of our iniquities we, our kings, and our priests, have been given into the hand of the kings of the lands, to the sword, to captivity, and to plunder and to open shame as it is this day."

So you see, my Jewish friend, Israel has a desperate need for a new covenant. How marvelous that individual Jews can enter into the blessings of that new covenant through Jesus, the Jewish Messiah, who died for the iniquities of Israel and for the whole world. He validated the covenant by sealing it with His own blood, and God raised Him from the dead, thus establishing the new covenant with Israel forever.

Just as Moses was a faithful mediator of the old covenant, so Jesus the Messiah and Son of God, is the faithful mediator of the new covenant for Israel, and what a superior covenant this is! For the law came by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ!

As individual lews, you and I, too, have sinned and broken the law of Moses, but with what compassion God has envisioned us when through the new covenant He invites us to come and place our trust in the Mediator of the new covenanteven Jesus. He is walting for you to invite Him into your life, to ask His forgiveness on your soul and to claim the inward regeneration and purity which He has promised. Through the gracious stipulations of the new covenant you may have forgiveness for past iniquity, and power to live a life pleasing to God. "Come now, and let us reason together, says the Lord; though your sins are as scarlet, they shall be white as snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall be like wool." (Isaiah 1:18).
