
Israel's 50th Anniversary Issue for the Peace erusalem appy Birthday Israe eonle



Shalom dear friend in the Messiah,

May the Prince of Peace fill you with His Shalom! As you have perhaps already noticed, this is a special expanded issue of the Chosen People Ministries newsletter commemorating the 50th anniversary of the modern State of Israel. We marvel at the faithfulness of God and the achievements of the brave and courageous few who carved a nation out of the arid terrain of the Promised Land.

There will be jubilant celebrations within Israel and throughout the world marking this momentous occasion. Yet, amidst the joy of celebrations and festivities, there exists a gnawing and almost painful realization that the tiny nation Israel is still so very fragile. Surrounded by hostile neighbors and beset by internal strife, modern Israel is not yet the nation of peace and strength she will someday become, as foretold by the ancient Hebrew prophets.

"The Gentiles shall see your righteousness, and all kings your glory. You shall be called by a new name, which the mouth of the LORD will name. You shall also be a crown of glory in the hand of the LORD, and a royal diadem in the hand of your God" (Isaiah 62:2–3).

Still, even today, the modern State of Israel remains a witness of God's covenant faithfulness and His power . . . if you know what you are looking at! Consider this:

- Israel was not a Jewish state for almost 2,000 years, and yet the "dry bones live" (see Ezekiel 37) and Israel has become primarily a Jewish nation once again.
- A little more than fifty years ago, the Jewish people were almost destroyed in the Holocaust; yet instead of becoming extinct, a nation has risen from the ashes of near annihilation.
- Though surrounded by enemies

of overwhelming proportions, Israel has been victorious in four modern wars with its enemies. The survival of the nation is a testimony to the faithfulness of God.

- The economy of the Land was almost non-existent fifty years ago—yet today, the desert has bloomed and the nation has prospered.
- Just when many thought that immigration had ceased, the "Land of the North" (Russia; Jeremiah 3:18) gave up vast numbers of Abraham's children and the little nation of Israel has surged in population growth: almost a million new immigrants in the last ten years.

Those who view the achievements of the Jewish people from a human perspective miss the hidden hand of God revealed in the establishment of the modern State of Israel. The God who promised a nation to the descendants of Abraham, Israe and Jacob (Genesis 12:1–3, 15:18–21, 17:1–8, 26:1–5, 35: 9–12) is the same God who assures that nation's future—and ours as well. The nation of Israel is a visible surety that God is faithful to His promises—all of His promises—whether to the nation of Israel or to His church.

The fate of the nation of Israel must matter to every born-again Christian—Jew or Gentile. We may not agree on every point of future prophecy and its fulfillment, but most believers today do recognize that

Israel is still the "apple of His eye" (Zechariah 2:8). The lewish people are God's chosen and His purposes for Israel are ongoing (Romans 11:11-15, 25-26).

Pray for the Peace of **lerusalem**

All believers everywhere are asked to pray for the peace of Jerusalem. The Psalmist wrote, "Pray for the peace of Jenisalem: 'May they prosper who love you" (Psalm 122:6). I am sure there are many reasons why we are told to pray for the peace of Jerusalem. Consider the following-meditate on these passages of Scripture—that the Lord might build a burning passion within your soul to pray for the peace and salvation of the Jewish people:

- Praying for the peace of lerusalem is dear to the heart of our Savior, who prayed for His people to return to the God of their fathers through Him (Matthew 23:37-39).
- Praying for Jerusalem was the burden of the Apostle Paul, who invited us to follow him as he followed the Lord (Romans 10:1).
- Praying for the peace of lerusalem will bring great blessing in the future for both Gentiles and Jews (Romans 11:15).
- Pray for the peace of Jerusalem, as Gentile Christians especially owe a debt of love to the Jewish people. It was the Jewish people who brought the Scriptures to the world and a Jewish remnant who brought the Messiah to the

Acts 11:19-21). As Jesus Himself said, "salvation is of the Jeus"

Pray for the peace of Jerusalem because it will be a blessing to you and your family. The promise of God to Abraham remains true today: "I will bless those who bless you, and I will curse him who curses you ... " (Genesis 12:3).

Pray for the peace of Jerusalem because of the spiritual kinship between lewish people and all born-again believers. After all, the history of the lewish people depicted in the Bible is also the spiritual history of every believer. The life lessons of ancient Israel are of supreme importance to Christians in every age (1 Corinthians 10:1-13). This connection draws our hearts close to the lewish people and motivates us to offer intercessory prayer on their behalf.

Pray for the peace of Jerusalem because by praying for peace, you are asking God to send His Son, the Prince of Peace, who will reign as King and bring blessing to all through His eternal presence. When we pray for the peace of Jerusalem, we are praying for the return of our Messiah, as the Apostle John records at the conclusion of the Book of the Revelation: "Even so, come, Lord Jesus!" (Revelation 22:20)

And please, when you pray for the peace of Jerusalem, remember to pray for Chosen People Ministries, your ministry among the Jewish people, as we proclaim the message of the Prince of Peace to the chosen people. I hope you will enjoy this special issue of the Chosen People Ministries newsletter. Happy birthday, Israel!

From Small Beginnings...

In the beginning, we were a small group—a few people united by faith and love, hungry for the Word and zealous to share the Good News. A small place in the city of Tel Aviv became home for those few of us who believed that Jesus was the Messiah of Israel. Slowly but surely, our Bible study became a congregation—immature and weak, but a congregation. The meeting place became too small and

the group moved to a new location in Jaffa. All the while, God continued to bring new people.

By this stage, it was very important to give the Jewish believers an understanding of the need for fellowship within the congregation and with other groups of believers in Israel. The people needed to know that they were an integral part of the body of Messiah in Israel.

To a Bold Work ...

Our ministry became holder, partially because of the growing maturity of the believers, and partially because of contact with other congregations and ministries. Very soon, we recognized that God wanted us to have Bible studies in different parts of the Land. We started home groups in the cities of Bat Yam (a suburb of Tel Aviv) and Ariel (on the West Bank!).

We also developed a new kind of evangelism ministry: Old Jaffa weekly walking tours. You have to see how people enjoy these tours! They ask so many questions about our faith, and about God, Jesus, and the Bible. A lot of them visit our Beth Sar Shalom congregation. Some of them have accepted Yeshua and have become part of the congregation.

Extending Throughout the Land

We believe that God wants us to start a new work in Jerusalem. We have prayed a lot, asking for the proper time and leading of the Holy Spirit, and God responded to us in a wonderful way. He brought us people and provided a place for our regular

Although I grew up in a traditional Jewish family in Tadjikistan (in the former Soviet Union), I became interested in Jesus at age 25. When I asked my family and friends if they knew anything about Him they were shocked and asked me to stop thinking this way immediately. After I moved away from home, I began reading the New Testament. I compared it with the Old Testament which we had read in our home, and I understood that Jesus was not just a fictional hero of literature, but the Son of God. I started to dream about going to Israel—His Land.

In 1995, I immigrated to Israel and asked God to lead me to other Jewish people who believed as I did. A Chosen People Ministries missionary invited me to attend his congregation. One day, Neriyah, a volunteer with Chosen People Ministries (and now a missionary in training at Moody Bible Institute), came to our home. He told me that Jesus was the Jewish Messiah and invited me to attend his congregation. There, I understood that Jesus is my personal Savior and Lord, and put my life into His hands. In 1997, I was baptized and now I have peace with God. Praise Him!



meetings. Yes, our group is still small-we are just at the very beginning. But we believe in God's strength, not in ours. We trust Him, asking for wisdom and love, and committing this work into His hands.

The tour ministry has been so successful that we are preparing to start similar tours in Jerusalem. We hope that, with our starting of Old City of Jerusalem Bible tours, God will bring a lot of new people to us. The first fruits are always the most precious. God is so great! Already, He is bringing people to our new fellowship in Jerusalem.

The Lord has brought people with talents and musical skills to our young congregation. As a result, a few times a year, we prepare a professional, evangelistic concert where musical pieces are presented with the full message of salvation through Yeshua. Many hundreds of people have come to such events and all of them had an opportunity to hear about the Messiah-some of them responded to the call to salvation.

Today in Chosen People **Ministries**

Today in Chosen People Ministries, we have three missionaries in Israel, and it is clear that we need more. There are so many opportunities! We are

praying that God will provide us with everything we need for a fruitful and successful work. Our God is a God of vision and He wants His people to be a people of vision. We believe that one day, Israel will respond to the Gospel. Isn't it a joy to know that you are part of this glorious plan?



The Bible foretells that peace between the Arab nations and Israel will come. It will arrive when the Peacemaker, Messiah Jesus, returns to set up His throne and reign over the kingdoms of the earth. Peace for the Arab world and the Jewish nation will be established in three ways:

(1) through the desolation of some Arab nations, (2) through the annexation of some Arab lands by Israel, and (3) through the spiritual transformation of some Arab

To see what the future holds for the Arab states, it is important to recognize that the Bible speaks of the future of specific Biblical nations. By identifying which modern Arab countries exist in the same geographic places as those Biblical nations, it may be possible to discern what the future holds for these Arab states.

1. Peace through Desolation

Southern Jordan

The southern area of the modern Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan was Dr. Michael Rydelnik

inhabited by the Biblical nation of Edom. Several Biblical prophets foretold the complete desolation of the Edomites, revealing the future of this part of Jordan.

In Ezekiel 35:1-15, God declared that the Edomites would be completely destroyed because they "had an ancient hatred, and have shed the blood of the children of Israel by the power of the sword ... " (Ezek, 35:5). The Lord assured the complete desolation of Edom (35:9) since they rejoiced over Israel because it was "desolate" (35:15). The same promise is found in Obadiah, where God compared the house of Jacob to a fire and Edom to

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stubble. Edom would be set on fire "so that no survivor shall remain of the house of Esau" (Obad. 18), In Jeremiah, God proclaimed that Edom would become "a desolation, a repreach, a waste and a curse. And all its cities shall be perpetual wastes" (Jer. 49:13). The future is bleak for the Southern area of Jordan. In the Messianic Kingdom, it will be completely desolate.

Southern Iraq

Both Isaiah and Jeremiah foretold that Babylon, the great capital of the Babylonian empire, would be desolate for all time. Isaiah said that Babylon "will never be inhabited nor will it be settled from generation to generation; nor will the Arabian pitch tents there" (Isa. 13:20). Jeremiah confirmed Isaiah's words, comparing Babylon's destruction to that of Sodom and Gomorrah (Jer. 50:39-40). This destruction occurred in stages, so that by 20 B.C., the Greek geographer Strabo called Babylon a "vast desolation."

2. Peace through Annexation

Ezekiel 47:13-20 describes the boundaries of Israel during the Messianic Kingdom. These look quite similar to Israel's borders during the reigns of David and Solomon, So, although the Bible does not explicitly state the future of these two

nations, clearly Lebanon and parts of Syria will experience peace with Israel by being annexed into the Jewish State during the Messianic Kingdom.

3. Peace through Transformation

The most encouraging news to be found in the Biblical prophecies regarding the Arab nations is that several of these will experience spiritual transformation. There will be some Arab states that will come to a

genuine faith in Messiah Jesus and share in the worldwide blessings of the Messianic Kingdom. This will be the way that they finally achieve peace with Israel.

Central and Northern Jordan

The Biblical nations of Moab and Ammon were situated in what is now the central and northern parts of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan. The destiny of Jordan includes not only desolation in the south (as was discussed above), but also hope of a remnant who will come to faith in the Messiah Jesus. In Jeremiah 48 and 49, the Lord first declares the future destruction of Moab and Ammon but then includes hope of restoration. These passages in Jeremiah look forward to the end of days, when a remnant of these two Biblical nations will put their faith in the Messiah and experience spiritual transformation. So, it seems that the Northern and Central parts of the modern kingdom of Jordan will find peace with Messiah and peace with Israel.

Egypt

From the time of the birth of the State of Israel in 1948 until Anwar el-Sadat addressed the Knesset (the Israeli parliament) thirty years later, Egypt had been an implacable enemy of Israel. Today, there is a peace treaty that has been sustained for twenty years, even though many consider it to be a "cold peace." However, the prophet Isaiah foresees Israel and Egypt experiencing a friendly peace when they both will know the Lord.

Isaiah prophesies that Egypt "will cry to the LORD because of the oppressors, and He will send them a Savior and a Mighty One, and He will deliver them" (Isa. 19:20). At that time, Egypt will have an altar to the LORD and will worship Him (Isa. 19:19, 21). According to Zechariah, the Egyptians will also celebrate Sukkot together with Israel in the Messianic Kingdom (Zech. 14:16-19). Egypt will be at peace with both her ancient enemy Assyria and Israel, with this threesome providing blessing to the whole earth (Isa. 19:24-25).


Syria and Northern Iraq

What was once the land of Assyria today includes Northern Iraq and Syria. In the great prophecy of Egypt's future redemption, the prophet Isaiah also indicates that Assyria will know the Lord, and through this spiritual transformation they will be peace partners with both Israel and Egypt. Assyria will worship with Egypt and Israel, indicating that people in Syria and Iraq will come to know Messiah Jesus and enter the Messianic Kingdom (Isa. 19:23), In that great day, "Israel will be one of three with Egypt and Assyria-a blessing in the midst of the land, whom the LORD of hosts shall bless, saying, Blessed is Egypt My people,

Peace Today?

Regardless of efforts toward political peace (which should be pursued) the ultimate possibility for true peace only exists through spiritual transformation. That is true today and it will be true in the Messianic Kingdom, Only when Israel and the Arab nations experience a spiritual transformation will peace arrive. And ultimately, that will only fully happen when the Peacemaker comes.

The wind has always blown over Jerusalem—the winds of war, the winds of change, the winds of threshing, the wind of the Spirit. For more than 3,000 years this blessed and besieged city has been shaped by the winds of time—but stands stronger and more purposeful today than ever.

Jerusalem—a city of sacrifice. In the irony of history—captured, rebuilt, torn down, laid waste—the city has almost become a sacrifice itself. In 1967, the city was occupied by Jewish forces for the first time since 70 A.D. The sight of Jewish soldiers kissing the Western Wall is etched forever in history. But, though now occupied by the Jewish people, Jerusalem has yet to fulfill its original name, Salem, from whence comes shalom, or the peace of God.

Today, Jerusalem is a city of birthpangs. It labors to receive the only One who can bring peace, the Prince of Peace, Jesus the Messiah. As we read the Scriptures, we recognize that the future of Jerusalem will be at the heart of the future of the world. In the end of days, we are told that God will restore His people to the land. At Messiah's second coming, the Jewish people in Jerusalem will repent in mourning and accept Jesus

Temple, where the Shekinah (glory cloud) of the Lord will reside (Ezek, 48:35).

During this period, Jerusalem will be the capital of the earth for a thousand years (Isa. 60:1-22; Ezek. 40-48; Rev. 20:11-15), and the Feast of Tabernacles will be observed annually (Zech. 14:16-19). Then from heaven will come "the Holy City, the New Jerusalem" (Rev. 21:2) which is described in Hebrews (12:22-24).

When we read of Jerusalem's humble beginnings, her painful past and present, and her glorious future,


we are reminded of our own spiritual lives. We are plain people in this earth, no more distinguishable than one rocky mountain top is from another. We suffer. We are threshed. We bleed—at least emotionally, and for some, literally—in our quest for the kingdom. And yet, like


Irvine, California
